A MOTHER'S LOVE THAT STARTED A MOVEMENT

Our late founder, Shari Duval, believed in the healing power of dogs. Her vision paved the way for K9s For Warriors to become a leading provider of trained Service Dogs for military Veterans with PTSD, traumatic brain injury and/or military sexual trauma.

In 2011, Shari made her vision to train rescue dogs as Service Dogs for Veterans a reality. When her son returned from Iraq with PTSD, she realized he was only himself around his dog. Shari put all her time and resources into restoring the lives of Veterans using Service Dogs.

For Shari, it wasn't only about assisting those who had sacrificed for our freedom — it was about fighting to save their lives. She started K9s For Warriors with her own money, in her garage, and watched it grow into a national nonprofit, serving Veterans from all around the country.

Sadly, we lost Shari in February 2021 after a courageous battle with cancer. She may no longer be with us, but her legacy remains with every Veteran and dog saved by K9s For Warriors. We know she would be proud of all we continue to accomplish.

WHO WE ARE

Every day in the United States, approximately 20 Veterans take their own lives and more than 1,000 dogs are euthanized. Determined to end Veteran suicide, K9s For Warriors provides highly-trained Service Dogs — many of them rescues — to Veterans suffering from PTSD, traumatic brain injury and/or military sexual trauma, at no financial cost to the Veteran.

Since 2011, K9s For Warriors has graduated more than 1,000 Warriors and rescued more than 2,000 dogs. With the majority of dogs being rescues, this innovative program allows the Warrior and Service Dog team to build an unwavering bond that facilitates their collective healing and recovery.

WHO WE SERVE

K9s For Warriors serves our Veterans as honorably as they served our country. Our lifelong program is provided to Warriors at no financial cost. We serve all-era Veterans suffering from the invisible wounds of war.

PTSD – POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER

TBI – TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY

MST – MILITARY SEXUAL TRAUMA

STATION DOGS: As part of our mission, K9s For Warriors also partners with law enforcement and first responder agencies to provide reliable, high-quality therapy dogs that offer emotional support to officers, firefighters, dispatchers, victims and others exposed to trauma in the line of duty. Station Dogs ease emotional stress common in this line of public service.

ADOPTABLE DOGS: While many of our dogs go on to become Service Dogs and are paired with a Veteran, some dogs are career-changed. At K9s For Warriors, we give every dog a purpose. Dogs that don't become Service Dogs or Station Dogs are adopted out to loving homes.





On behalf of the entire K9s For Warriors team, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude for your unwavering support. Your dedication to our Veterans and Service Dogs is the driving force behind us. Because of you, we continue to grow and make a lasting impact on so many lives. Thank you for being an essential part of our mission.

Every day in the United States, approximately 20 Veterans take their own lives. This is not just a number, it's someone's life. A loved one. 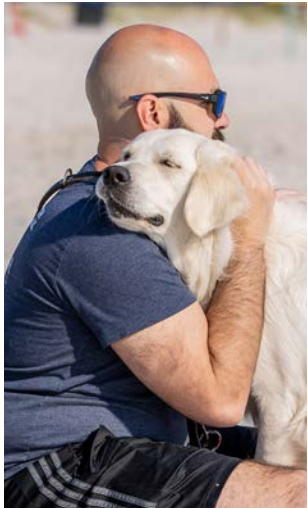
GRADUATES #1000

In March 2024, we hit our biggest milestone yet: graduating our 1,000th Warrior and Service Dog team. That's 2,000 lives forever changed! This celebration was a testament to the dedication and support of K9s For Warriors team members — past and present — volunteers, donors and Veteran families. Through their collective efforts, we made great strides in our mission set forth by the late Shari Duval. All 1,000 Veterans received their Service Dogs at no financial cost to them. Receiving a trained Service Dog at no cost was one of the major reasons Retired Army Staff Sergeant Ryan decided to apply.

“Every one of the thousand Warriors have been loved by this organization, by the people here, by the donations and by the surrounding community,” said Ryan. *“Frankie has already significantly reduced my anxiety and provides me comfort and support in what used to be high anxiety situations.”*

This major milestone highlights the incredible impact Service Dogs have on the lives of our nation's heroes and their families. As K9s For Warriors continues to provide Veterans with lifesaving Service Dogs, we are committed to saving even more lives in the years to come. Roughly 20 Veterans take their own lives each day. Our work is not done until '20' a day becomes 'zero' a day.

CHARLIE AND LADY CAMEO

“K9S FOR WARRIORS GAVE ME MY LIFE BACK.”

28-year Navy Veteran Charlie was one of the first Warriors to graduate from K9s For Warriors in 2011. His first Service Dog, Slider, had a profound impact on his life. After 13 wonderful years together, Slider sadly passed away from old age. Charlie knew he needed to come back through the program to meet his new battle buddy.

“If it wasn’t for Slider, I wouldn’t be here today,” Charlie shared. ***“He not only helped me, but he helped my family.”***

Charlie started going downhill fast when he lost Slider. He reached back out to K9s and was immediately added to the March 2024 class. K9s paired Charlie with a lovable Lab named Lady Cameo.

“We immediately hit it off. She loves to give licks and kisses, but she also knows when I’m starting to have a trigger,” he said.

Charlie and Lady Cameo have been together for over a year now. She goes everywhere with him, even to work every day at the Jacksonville Naval Museum on board the USS Orleck. Charlie can’t imagine life without his Service Dog.

POLICY-LEVEL REFORM

In the United States, tens of thousands of Service Dogs help Veterans get back to a life of dignity and independence. With such a high demand for Service Dogs across the country, K9s For Warriors contributes to policy-level reform at the White House, U.S. Department of Defense (DoD), U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) and on Capitol Hill.

Advocating for Veterans and Service Dogs will always be one of our top priorities. We are committed to bringing widespread awareness to Veterans' mental health, suicide prevention efforts and ensuring more Veterans have access to alternative treatment modalities like Service Dogs.



FY25 NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT (NDAA)

After successfully advocating for increased funding and report language in the FY24 NDAA, K9s was officially awarded a \$650,000 grant from DoD's Wounded Warrior Service Dog Program. The federal grant provides K9s with the opportunity to train and place more Service Dogs with Veterans in need, highlighting our continued partnership with DoD and the Office of Suicide Prevention.

THE SERVICE DOGS ASSISTING VETERANS ACT

K9s continues to champion the bipartisan, bicameral Service Dogs Assisting Veterans (SAVES) Act on Capitol Hill. The SAVES Act aims to establish a competitive grant program at the VA for qualified nonprofit organizations dedicated to providing Service Dogs to Veterans free of charge.

The bill authorizes \$10 million for each of the fiscal years after enactment, totaling \$50 million over five years. If passed, it will ensure nonprofits are equipped to pair more Veterans with highly trained, life-changing Service Dogs to assist them with both visible and invisible disabilities.

THE PROMOTING EMOTIONAL ASSISTANCE WITH RELIEF AND LOVE ACT (PEARL)

K9s worked with bipartisan members of Congress to draft and introduce the PEARL Act. The bill would authorize Congress to appropriate \$1 million to U.S. Customs and Border Patrol's (CBP) Support Canine Program, ultimately augmenting K9s' existing Station Dog partnership with CBP, which provides therapy dogs to first responders to aid in emotional stress common in this line of police service.

NATIONAL SERVICE DOG DAY

National Service Dog Day celebrates the loving, hardworking and special Service Dogs that support many Americans with disabilities. The unanimous passing of a historic, bipartisan Congressional resolution designated September 20th as National Service Dog Day each year. K9s was instrumental in getting the day nationally recognized and, after passing Congress, a proclamation issued by the White House was signed by President Joe Biden, recognizing the special day.

National Service Dog Day recognizes all types of Service Dogs. Roughly 61 million Americans (about 26%) are living with disabilities, according to the CDC. The resolution states that tens of thousands of Service Dogs are estimated to be working today for Americans with a wide range of challenges, including epilepsy, visual, hearing and mobility impairments, post-traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injuries and other disabilities.

SERVICE DOGS WORK



First NIH- funded clinical trials shows Service Dogs lower severity of ptsd symptoms in Veterans

K9s For Warriors

The first National Institutes of Health-funded clinical trial of its kind links the pairing of Service Dogs with Veterans to lowered PTSD severity, odds of a diagnosis and other negative mental health symptoms. Led by Dr. Maggie O'Haire from the University of Arizona College of Veterinary Medicine in partnership with K9s For Warriors, the study examined more than 150 Veterans over three months through self-reported symptoms and expert clinician assessment.

THE RESULTS REVEALED:

- **Veterans with Service Dogs had 66% lower odds of a PTSD diagnosis** based on expert clinician assessment when compared to a wait-listed control group.
- They also experienced **lower anxiety and depression levels**, which often co-occur with PTSD.
- **They experienced improvements in most areas of emotional and social well-being.**



*"This research reinforces what we have been studying for almost a decade — that **Service Dogs are linked to significant benefits for many Veterans suffering from PTSD and other invisible wounds of war.** Service Dogs are more than pets — they can be essential partners in helping Veterans readjust and thrive after they return from service."*



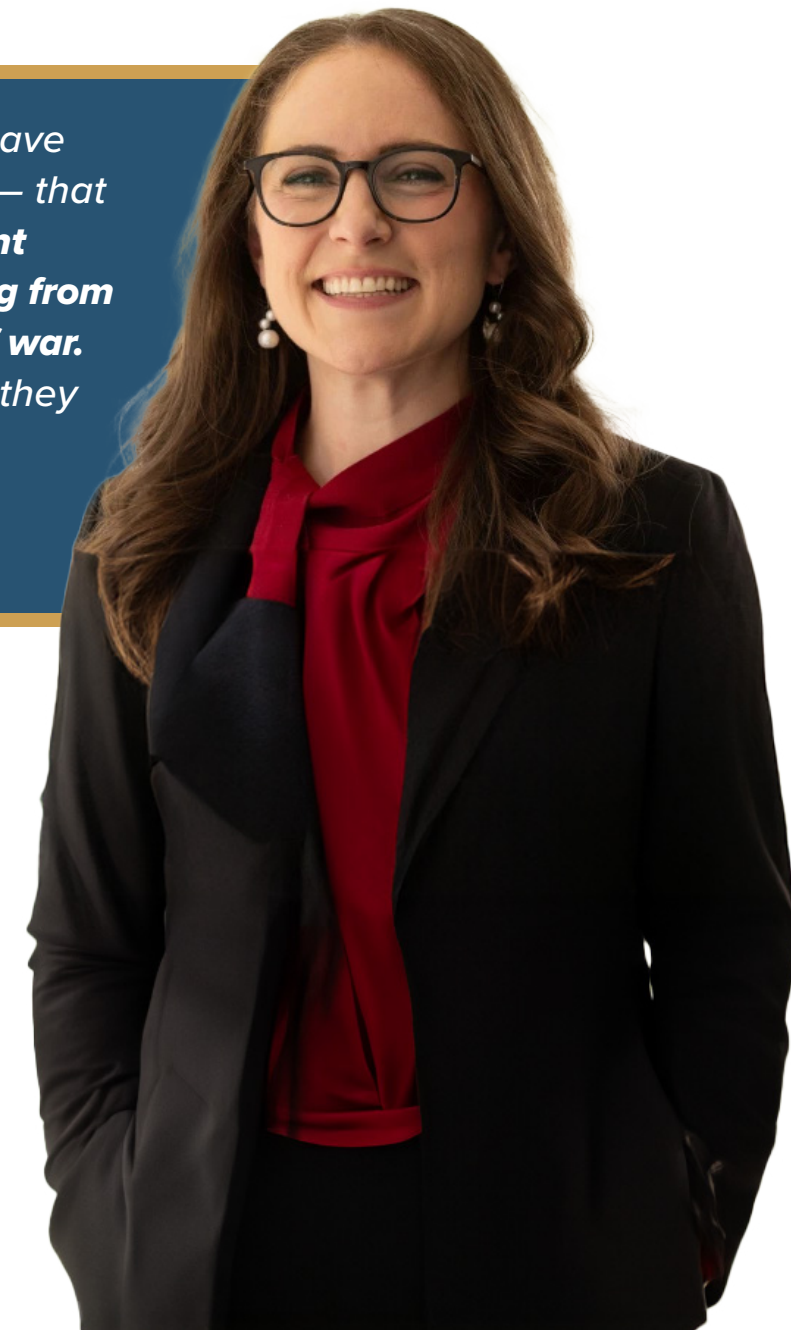

The study was published in **JAMA Network Open** in June 2024. It is the first study of its kind to use gold-standard, blinded clinician ratings of PTSD to measure outcomes.

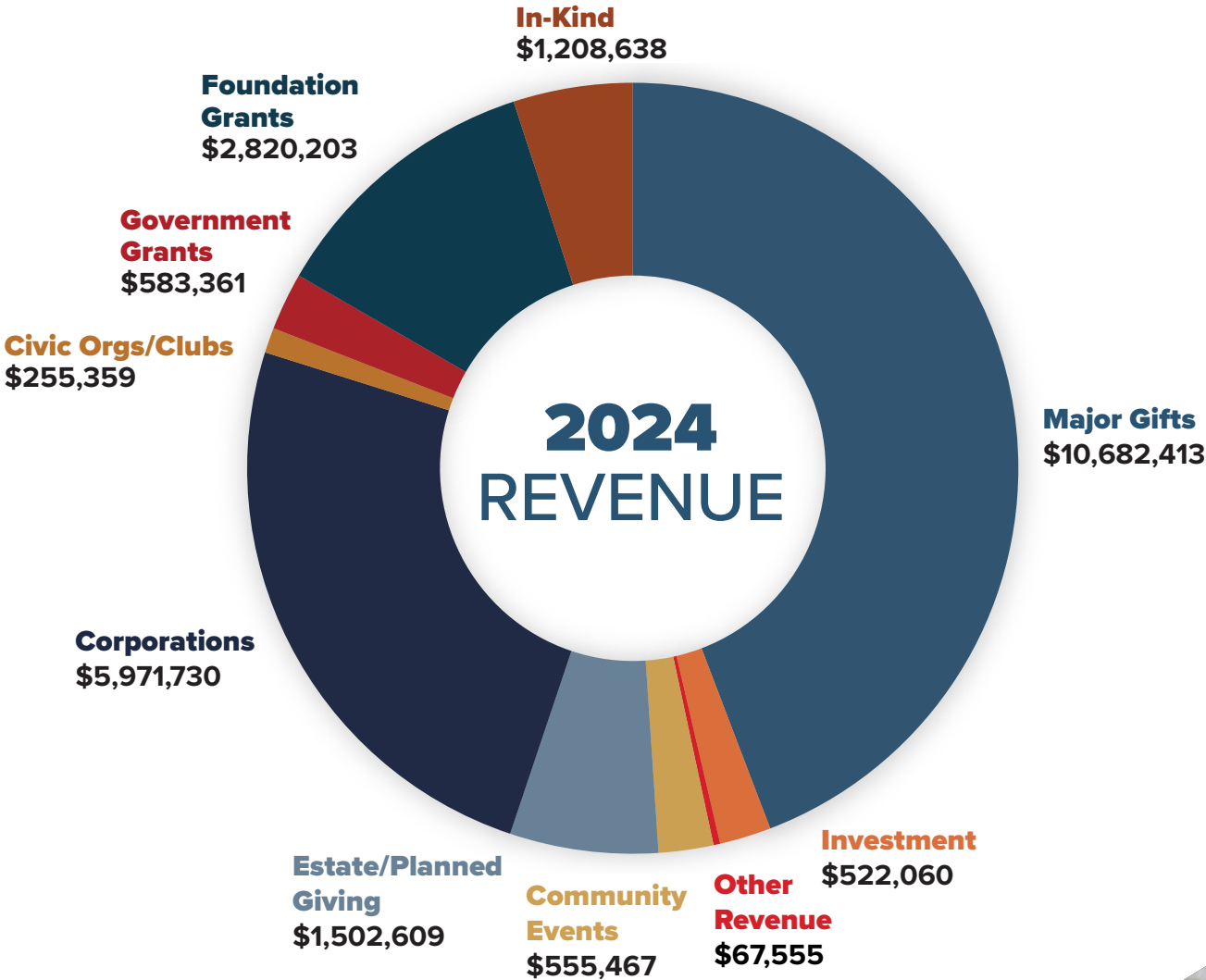

Each team sponsors a future Service Dog and aids in its valuable public access training before being paired with a Veteran in need.

“My Service Dog is a huge jump in the right direction for me,” said Navy Veteran Ellis, whose Service Dog was sponsored by the Browns and CrossCountry Mortgage. “Valor is a strong dog. He helps me and it’s only going to get better from here.”

“I know K9s nailed it on the head in terms of a pairing,” said Army Veteran Steven, who was paired with former Jaguars Team Dog, Sunshine. “We are absolutely perfect together.”

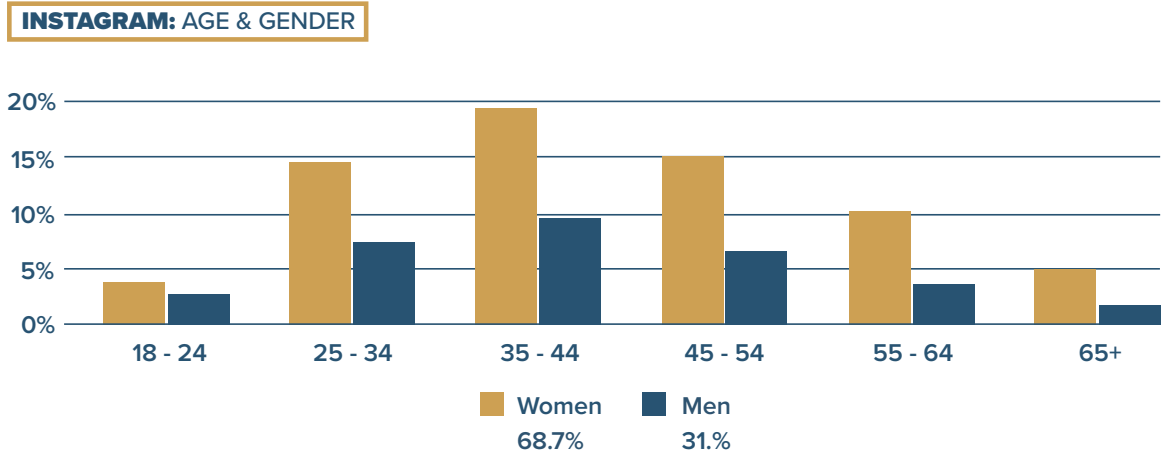
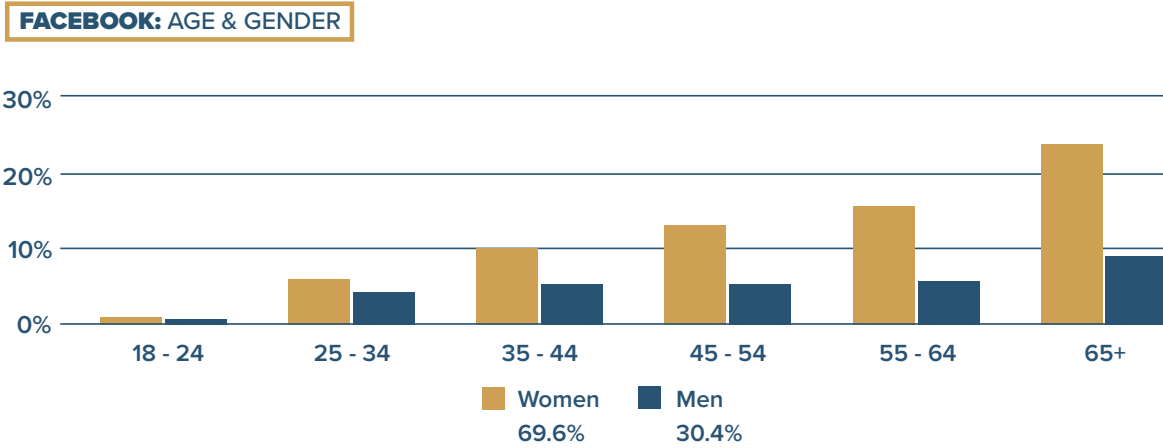
